B) Commitments and Actions

I/we, the undersigned, understand that the Bee City Canada program consists of three commitments, and that we will take the indicated actions to support those commitments:

1. **Creating Healthy Pollinator Habitat:** Describe your plans to create, improve and maintain pollinator habitat, while reducing or eliminating pesticide use.

We are beekeepers producing honey and honey products through our company B Sweet Honey Nature Co. In conjunction with our honey business we operate a small native nursery specializing in Carolinian trees, shrubs and pollinator plants. All this occurs on our pesticide free farm. We have had an ongoing invasive removal program preparing for our next phase. This year we will be installing permanent wildflower meadow, cover crops and auxiliary strips and converting marginal farmland to excellent habitat for all pollinators. We will also be planting and designating certain tracts of land for specialist bees. We are installing bumble bee bend grass breeding sites at optimal locations. We also want to implement the creation of beetle banks to encourage 'beneficial' insects.
